Update on Hybrid course approved last fall.

hybrid delivery this semester has been extremely positive. She is meeting the students for one hour each week with the repaining two hours conducted online. All nine students enrolled have expressed positive comments. They like the opportunity to transition to a strictly online delivery. The one shy student has expressed that the online interaction has made the in class interaction easier. Even the one student opposed to online classes has been positively impressed. Ms. Camacho has begun each on campus class with a question and answer session on the hybrid format leading to ongoing adjustments. The online portion has been primarily lecture, forum question responses and research. She is able to track the time spent online by each student and the students are well aware of this capability. She has the same expectations of students as in an on campus class. A recent online assignment was due midnight on Sunday and the one student who failed to submit the assignment on time would be docked. She has used on campus class for lecture and interactive assignments. The first exam, Monday will be on campus, but she plans on online exams as well. Cheryl Aschenbach, Title III Coordinator, indicated that faculty interested in pursuing online or hybrid courses should contact their

division chairs. Future cohort meetings will be scheduled to assist faculty with development and implementation of online and hybrid delivery. A question on the delivery of laboratory online was posed. The time spent on laboratory activities would need to be tracked since credit is earned for hours in laboratory.
