Methods of Evaluation

Hybrid Delivery

A combination of traditional classroom and online evaluations will be used. These include objective examinations and essay examinations in the traditional classroom setting and online quizzes and exams, essay forum postings, chat rooms, and email communications in the hybrid component of the course.

Methods of Delivery

Hybrid Delivery

A combination of traditional classroom and online instruction will be utilized. Each semester 17 lecture hrs and 34 hrs lab will be taught face-to-face by the instructor and 8.5 lecture hrs and 42.5 hrs lab will be instructed online through the technology platform adopted by the District, currently Moodle. Traditional class instruction will consist of lectures, visual aids, and group presentations. Online delivery will consist of participation in forum-based discussions and posts, web links, email communications, lecture posts, and online lectures.

Catalog Description

Basic operations of Microsoft Word. In addition, a study of concepts of word processing will provide students with the background necessary to help them adapt to various situations they will encounter when employed. E. ENGL 12 Survey of American Literature II (Aschenbach/Gardiner: MSCU)

Approved change in SLO's, course content, writing assignments, Expected outside assignments, and Representative texts and Supplies.

New SLO's:

1. After reading a particular selection of American Literature from the post-Civil War era to the present the student will critically analyze and evaluate the work, determining whether it is an example of realism, naturalism, or modern writing, how dialect and tone are used and if the subject matter is unique or common for the period of time in which it was written.

From course readings and class discussions, students will be able to identify literary patterns, historical contexts, and/or biographical correlations that are specific to Post-Civil War American literary movements, schools of writing, or authors of note.

2. Given the assignment to prepare a reading log for work covered during the class, the student will review the work's historical and literary placement, outline the plot and characters, describe the writing style, and provide a personal assessment of the selection in comparison to others studied in the

From course readings and class discussions, students will be able to write an extended literary analysis that is conscious of the tones, styles, and forms that are specific to Post-Civil War American literary movements, schools of writing, or authors of note.
