Hybrid Evaluation

A combination of traditional classroom and online evaluations will be used, such as (2) Traditional Classroom: a variety of lecture, demonstrations and hands-on lab assignments, objective examinations and class participation (1) Online delivery: activities and assignments required in traditional class time will be placed into online modules.

Hybrid Delivery

A combination of traditional classroom and online instruction will be utilized. Every week, one 140 minute class period will be taught face-to-face by the instructor and the other 50 minutes will be instructed online through the technology platform adopted by the District, currently Moodle. Traditional class instruction will consist of lectures, visual aids, and group presentations. Online delivery will consist of participation in forum-based discussions and posts, web links, email communications, lecture posts, and online lectures

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F. PSY 1 Introduction to Psychology (Aschenbach/Oberg: MSCU)

Approved change in Hybrid delivery hours.

In class (1 hour/week) introduction to the topic of the week and assigned readings, in class exams and in class opportunity for discussion and review of topics covered. Online (2 hrs/week) instructor generated lecture material, exercises, website media relevant to the topic. Opportunity for electronic communication between instructor and student (private messaging) and between instructor and all students (forum based discussion.)

A combination of traditional classroom and online instruction will be utilized. Each semester 34 lecture hrs will be taught face-to face by the instructor

and 17 lecture hours will be instructed online through the technology platform adopted by the District, currently Moodle. Traditional class instruction will consist of lectures, visual aids, and group presentations. Online delivery will consist of participation in forum-based discussions and posts, web links, email communications, lecture posts, and online lectures.

G. PSY 5 Introduction to Research Methods(Aschenbach/Oberg: MSCU)

Approved change in Hybrid delivery hours.

A combination of traditional classroom and online instruction will be utilized. Every week, one 50 minute class period will be taught face to face by the instructor and the other 100 minutes will be instructed online through the technology platform adopted by the District, currently Moodle. Traditional class instruction will consist of lectures, multimedia presentations, and group discussions. Online delivery will consist of participation in forum based discussions and posts, web links, email communications, lecture posts, and online lectures.

H. PSY 6 Abnormal Psychology(Aschenbach/Oberg: MSCU)

Approved Change in Hybrid delivery hours.

A combination of traditional classroom and online delivery will be used. One 50 minute period will be taught face to face by the instructor using lecture, group discussion, and selected audiovisual materials; the other 100 minutes per week will be instructed online using a variety of methods, such as asynchronous and synchronous discussions (chat/forum), online quizzes, weblinks, lecture posts and online lectures, and email communications.

A combination of traditional classroom and online instruction will be utilized. Each semester 34 lecture hrs will be taught face-to face by the instructor and 17 lecture hours will be instructed online through the technology platform adopted by the District. Traditional class instruction will consist of lectures, visual aids, and group presentations. Online delivery will consist of participation in forum-based discussions and posts, web links, email communications, lecture posts, and online lectures.

5. Discussion

A. BS 170 Basic Skills: Pre High School Equivalency Preparation I

New course BS 170 Basic Skills: Pre High School Equivalency Preparation I. There is a need in our area for GED prep. The development of the course was funded by the AB86 Grant.

Catalog Description:

This course provides basic skills review and practice in the five core curricular areas of language arts reading, language arts writing, science, social studies, and math. Emphasis is placed on these particular areas to provide the the necessary basic skills foundation required in preparing for high school equivalency test. This course may be repeated until outcomes are met.

Effective: After Board and CCCCO Approval

The exam has been changed twice since the last time we taught the GED courses. It now has 4 subject areas instead of 5. Instead of having the three courses in specific subjects, reading, writing and math, the new courses are designed to include all subject areas. This will allow the student to concentrate on the subjects they need the most help in. The first course is a basic level course and the second course is more advanced for the student that has been assessed at the 10th grade level. AB86 grant identified the need in our community for these courses. Move the courses to action at our next meeting with a few revisions. Courses are deemed repeatable by the state but our Committee discussed whether we want to set a district cap. Since these classes are designed to help students who struggled to complete their high school diploma the Committee decided to leave the repeatability uncapped.

B. BS 171 Basic Skills: Pre High School Equivalency Preparation II

New course BS 171 Basic Skills: Pre High School Equivalency Preparation II. There is a need in our area for GED prep. The development of the course was funded by the AB86 Grant.

This is a 10 week course designed for students who complete the assessment test at the 10th grade level in reading and math and who need additional review and practice before taking the test. The course provides short term, in depth instruction focused on content areas of the high school equivalency test. This course may be repeated until the High School Equivalency test is passed. Effective: After Board and CCCCO Approval
