# **Catalog Description**

This course prepares the students in 9 weeks to be able to perform venipunctures, capillary punctures, and basic blood laboratory tests expected of entry-level medical assisting phlebotomy positions in elinies hospitals and other health care settings consistent with health care regulations in California. With successful completion of this course, including 50 successful venipunctures and 10 successful skin punctures, the student will be eligible to sit for the exam to become a Certified Phlebotomist Technician with the State of California.
