I-suite is a data entry system used on wildland fire incidents. This course will teach—students how to use the I-suite computer system. How to enter data online and interface with other data systems on a wildland fire incident.

A course designed to bring out the responsibilities of the individual in charge of the initial attack of small, non-complex fires that are routinely suppressed by local initial attack forces and assure that local policies and practices are understood by the initial attack leader.

#### 5. Discussion

#### A. **ART 38 3-D Computer Modeling and Animation**

Discuss new course. 3.0 units/25.5 Hours Lecture/76.5 Hours Laboratory **Catalog Description** 

This course introduces students to the use of software techniques to create and animate three-dimensional environments and objects. Students will learn to create photo-realistic models and scenes enhanced by lighting, shadows, reflection, and textures, and will learn to produce camera fly-through and basic character animation sequences. To cover the costs of printing proofs for each project assignment, a \$10.00 lab fee will be charged at the time of registration. This course has been approved for online delivery.

#### FS 68 Essentials of Firefighting B.

Discuss new course. 2 units, 32 hours lecture, 8 hours lab

#### **Catalog Description**

This course will introduce the student to the basic fundamentals of Structure firefighting. It will introduce the student to personal protective equipment, water supply and the different tools used in the industry. Its focus will be on the skills needed to obtain entry level skills to gain employment with a Fire Department

It was discussed that this course might be one that we offer at Lassen High School as part of a dual enrollment program. The members present were reminded that high school students must meet our Special Admit process by assessing and scoring into English 105 or higher, and math 103 if appropriate, deemed by the Academic Senate.

Move course to action next meeting with a content review of ENGL 105 as recommended prep

#### C. FS 92 Company Officer All-Risk Command Operations

Discuss new course. 1.5 units 20 hours lecture and 20 hours lab **Catalog Description** 

This course provides information on conducting incident size-up, developing and implementing an initial plan of action involving single and multi-unit operations

for various types of emergency incidents to mitigate the situation following

agency safety procedures, conducting pre-incident planning, and develop and conduct a post-incident analysis.

Cal-Fire is back logged offering this course, would like it to be offered at the community college to make sure course is taught correctly and to keep better track of students taking the course. Move forward to next meeting.

## D. FS 93 Fire Fighter I

Discuss new Course. 21 units 160-180 hours lecture 480-540 lab hours (minimum hours would be 18.5 units)

## **Catalog Description**

This course provides the skills and knowledge needed for the entry level fire fighter, career or volunteer, to perform his/her duties safely, effectively, and competently. The curriculum is based on the 2013 edition of NFPA 1001 Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications, the 2012 edition of NFPA 1051 Standard for Wildland Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications, and the 2008 edition of NFPA 472 Standard for Competence of Responders to Hazardous Materials/Weapons of Mass Destruction Incidents. The seven overarching themes of the California State Fire Fighter I curriculum are: general knowledge germane to the profession, fire department communications, fireground operations, rescue operations, preparedness and maintenance, wildland suppression activities, and hazardous materials/WMD.

There was discussion that this course would be better offered as Contract Ed. Cal-Fire requires more hours if class size is more than 25.

Use minimum hours and units capping class at 25 students.

Chad was aware that the content was lacking on the course outline but wanted feedback from the committee on how to condense the 54 pages. It was suggested that he use the main topics not go into too much detail. Bring back for discussion with content added.

#### E. MATH 157A Fractions Basic Skill

Discuss new basic skills course. Non-credit/2 hours lecture/18 hours lab Catalog Description

This course covers mathematical basic skills and problem solving for students needing a refresher in fractions. Through an online assessment, this open entry course using ALEKS.com focuses on the basic skills students need in fractions prior to or when concurrently enrolled in another math course. Instruction is individualized through ALEKS.com. This is a non-credit course.

Veed more clarification on how class is going to be taught. Are the students going to be put on the computer as a class? Wouldn't this make the class all Lab and online delivery? How is this going to be offered? Will it be part of the lab already offered or as a separate class?

#### F. MATH 157B Decimals Basic Skills

Discuss new course. Non-credit/2 hours lecture/18 hours lab Catalog Description

This course covers mathematical basic skills and problem solving for students needing a refresher in decimals. Through an online assessment, this open entry course using ALEKS.com focuses on the basic skills students need in decimals prior to or when concurrently enrolled in another math course. Instruction is individualized through ALEKS.com. This is a non-credit course.
