Course includes human sexuality, conception, pregnancy, labor, delivery, postpartum and care of the newborn. Access to a computer with internet access is required. Students must complete all course hours and must achieve a 75% on their final class grade and must achieve a final exam grade of 75% or better to be eligible to remain in the nursing program. This course has been approved for hybrid delivery and online delivery for emergency use only. Traditional Classroom Instruction
