What do I need to bring with me to register?

Students will need to bring their official sealed high school transcript, a state issued photo identification card, social security card and a copy of their 2018 Federal Tax return (or their parents' tax return)

Can my parents register for me?

Students shall be present to register for the gunsmithing program, parents cannot register for their child.

What happens if I am an alternate or placed on the waitlist?

Students will be assigned a number in order in which they arrive. The first 22 students and 8 alternates will complete the registration process. If one of the first 22 students drops out of the gunsmithing program, the alternates will be contacted in order and offered the opportunity to attend the gunsmithing program.

Students on the waitlist and alternates will be given priority for the following year.

What is the California Department of Justice Certificate of Eligibility?

A "Certificate of Eligibility" certifies the Department of Justice (DOJ) has checked its records and determined the recipient is not prohibited from acquiring or possessing firearms at the time the firearms eligibility criminal background check was performed. A COE is a pre-requisite licensing/permit requirement for all prospective licensed firearms dealers, licensed ammunition vendors, manufacturers, certified instructors, gun show promoters, explosive permit holders, and other firearm related employment activities, including, any agent or employee of a vendor who handles, sells, or delivers firearms and ammunition. The initial COE application process includes a firearms eligibility criminal background check and issuance of a certificate, which is valid for one year. Thereafter, the COE must be renewed annually. A COE can be revoked, at any time, if the COE holder becomes prohibited from owning/possessing firearms and ammunition.

How long is the Gunsmithing Program?

The Gunsmithing Program is 2 years long consisting of gunsmithing specific courses. If a student successfully completes all of the assigned courses with passing grades, the student will be eligible for all of the Certificates of Accomplishment/Achievement. The Associate of Science Degrees will require additional general education courses. Be sure to talk to your counselor to learn what it takes to obtain an Associates of Science Degree.

What should I expect in the Gunsmithing Program?

LCC's Gunsmithing program focuses on firearm design, function and repair. The Gunsmithing courses are 1 -2 weeks long and class hours are Monday through Friday 8am to 5pm. There is a first year student class and a second year student class offered each week. During the first year of the program, students will take a night welding course held on Monday and Wednesday nights. Additionally there is a

lab class option on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings where students can work on their class projects outside of their regular class time.

How much is tuition?

In state tuition is \$46/unit.

*Non-resident tuition is \$311/unit.

A student can expect to take 16-22 units per semester for 4 semesters.

What is the cost for tools and firearms?

The cost will vary depending on how many firearms you own and how many you have to purchase. It could cost up to \$25,000 or more. It should be noted that students will not need all of the firearms on the first day of school and can be acquired throughout the program.

Where can I purchase firearms?

Students can find firearms to purchase at online brokers, pawn shops and gun shops. Firearms can be broken, used or new.
