Catalog Description

~~This course is the first semester of a two semester sequence. The sequence is intended for students not majoring in Physics or Engineering. The core topics include: fundamental descriptions of motion and its causes, the physical and thermal properties of matter, and the transfer of energy in waves.~~

This course provides an introduction to the principles and applications of mechanics, using the mathematical tools of algebra and right triangle trigonometry. Topics include vectors, kinematics, Newton's laws, gravity, energy and momentum, mechanics of rigid bodies, heat, fluids and simple harmonic motion.

B. PHYS 2B General Physics II (Mouck/Oberg: MSCU)

Catalog Description

~~This course is the second course in the two course sequence. The sequence is intended for students not majoring in Physics or Engineering. The core topics include: fundamental descriptions of the relationship of matter and energy, including electricity and magnetism, ray and wave optics, and atomic structure.~~

This course is a continuation of PHYS 2A, covering mechanical waves (including sound), electricity, magnetism, geometric optics, interference and diffraction and elementary modern physics.
