Starfish Solutions is a retention solution program that helps to create an online student success environment, facilitating programs such as counseling and advising, tutoring, mentoring, and others--with the aim of improving student success and retention..

You have already started down a path to success. It may not be a smooth or easy road, but you can do it! The Starfish platform is a powerful tool for LCC to help you finish what you start.

Features of Starfish


- Ask for help--you don't have to wait for a problem to occur. Starfish will automatically route your need to the right person on campus to help you.
- Learn immediately when there's a concern about your academic performance or something else that is interfering with your studies.
- Quickly discover which support services are available to you, where they are, and how best to reach out to them.
- Schedule time online to meet with an advisor, tutor, instructor, financial aid, or any of the other people put in place to help you succeed.
- Receive notifications and reminders on the device you prefer.
- Learn the next steps to take to proceed in your academic path or to resolve a concern. Check in on your own progress as often as needed.
- Become inspired by the encouraging messages from the people who recognize your hard work.

Make a Financial Game Plan for College

Take some time to understand the financial ramifications of college, if you haven't already. How much will college cost you? What will you owe when you leave? How are you going to pay for it? Gain an understanding of the different types of loans, grants, and other types of aid. Create a budget based off what you have saved, your income, and your financial aid. Keep track of what you're spending and live cheaply. Take advantage of all the things LCC offers to alleviate costs-free food around campus, free access to computers and printers, tutoring to help you pass classes, free bus passes, free textbook lending library, discounts at local stores, student employment and more.

It's Never to Late to Fill out the FAFSA. There's Still Time, but it's Better to Act Soon!

The FAFSA (FREE Application for Federal Student Aid) opened Oct. 1, 2018, for the 2019-2020 school year, but it's not too late for students who haven't filed. Some Financial Aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, or from programs with limited funds. To help save time, families can use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, which can expedite the process by automatically syncing and populating tax return information into the FAFSA.

CHALK OUT STIGMA PROJECT

On May 7th, LCC Ambassadors, students and staff could be seen drawing with chalk on the sidewalks surrounding the cafeteria and other campus buildings in an effort to Chalk Out Stigma. This project was about raising mental health awareness and reducing the stigma surrounding seeking help. Chalk Out Stigma is a project that was started by Active Minds several years ago. Active Minds is a nonprofit organization dedicated to raising mental health awareness among college students and was founded by a young woman who lost her brother to suicide in 2003. Stigma is perceived as something negative that can leave an individual feeling devalued. If someone is dealing with a mental health issue, stigma can leave them feeling ashamed and can prevent them form reaching out for help. Just starting the conversation about mental health can be a big step for helping others around you. After all, we know 1 in 4 college students have a diagnosable mental health disorder. Mental Health awareness is about:

- -Talking more openly about this subject
- -Educating yourself-we are learning more every day
- -Thinking about the language you use
- -Respecting the difference between a true mental health disorder and personality quirks or behavior
 - -Focusing on personal strengths, not the illness
