It was agreed that a workgroup should meet to discuss the process and determine what needs to be done to prepare and later to transition to Accuplacer NextGen. The workgroup will be Patrick Walton, David Corley, Alison Somerville, plus all FT English and math faculty. One question that needs to be answered: Will Accuplacer be processing the data for us? They did previously, and if they don't then we can't set new scores as we don't have the capacity to process the data.

- Administration (5 min) Karissa Morehouse reported the following:
  - a. Cougar Countdown to finals will be in December. There will be different activities available to students every day through finals week.
  - b. The website conversion is expected by Friday 11/17. There should be a training offered in December so people can update web pages.
  - c. LHS is having a suicide alert workshop. There are a lot of mental health issues at LHS and at LCC. Karissa spoke of a grant for behavioral sciences (\$40,000). She'll be meeting with Lassen County Behavioral Health to discuss options, including direct resources for crisis situations and preventative training for staff and students.
- LCFA (5 min) Carrie Nyman, LCFA President, reported the following:
  - a. Negotiations are at an impasse. District countered LCFA's proposal with a 1%, 1%, 1% offer but only to be effective 60 days after ratification; there is no incentive for the Board to act unless we push for changes to be retroactive to July 1 when the old contract ended.
