Discussion

- 1. Program alignment/guided pathways
 - This item was included as a result of discussion at the Guided Pathways Retreats held earlier this month and out of concern for an article in the Lassen County Times about a First Responder program at Lassen High School. Why are we not a partner and working at building pathways with our K-12 colleagues? Dr. Albertson explained that this is an area he'll be addressing as he gets started as dean with responsibilities over CTE programs. Adam Runyan also shared that personnel at Modoc High School have expressed an interest in LCC being their primary provider rather than relying on Shasta and Siskiyous.
- 2. Local Goals Alignment with CCCCO Vision for Success Cheryl shared that all colleges are required to align their local goals with the six goals of the Board of Governors/CCCCO Vision for Success. We should see more of this woven into conversations, especially with planning committees, in the future.

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Information

Falling into Guided Pathways Retreat was received well by those who were able to attend. It was noted that we need a repository of guided pathways information.

- Senators (3 min each) Andy reminded everyone that the college catalog will need to be updated with the AB 705 information and changes to assessment and placement.
- Administration (5 min). Dr. Albertson expressed his interest in helping faculty and students at LCC. He's glad to be here. Randy reported that at Dr. Hall's request, he'll be doing a weekly tracking update on program reviews.
- LCFA (5 min) Carrie reported that there is an end of the year faculty gathering being planned for December 18 at her house. She also reported that CCA presidents are discussion dual enrollment. It seems some high school faculty are not qualified to teach college classes yet students are getting college credit through dual enrollment. LCC doesn't have this problem but needs to stay aware of issues that arise at other colleges. CCA has a task force working on it.
