With a quorum present, the meeting began at 1:05 pm.

Consultation Council:

1. Annual Evaluation of the Shared Governance and Planning Structure and Procedures (Governance)–

Sue Mouck announced that this item would be delayed until next week to allow the evaluation results from the classified employees to be included.

2. 2012 Employee Evaluation for the 2014 Accreditation Self Evaluation Results and Comparison to 2011 Results (Information)

Dr. Kayleigh Carabajal presented a brief overview of the evaluation results. Fifty-three employees completed the survey. The distribution of full time employees shifted from last year with more full-time staff and fewer full-time faculty participated. Terry Bartley suggested that this implied greater involvement by staff, which is a good thing. The survey is broken down into questions derived from each of the four standards for accreditation. Of the forty-eight questions, thirty-nine exhibited an increase in percentage of respondents selecting "strongly agree" or "agree" as compared to last year. And for six question, the percentage increase was greater than 25% over last year. Only four questions showed percentage lower as compared to last year. There were three open-ended questions on how to improve communication, planning and the comprehensive institutional master plan. A summary of the results of those responses was included. Dr. Carabajal indicated that several comments did not apply to the question. For instance one response concerned the need for the institution to plan for rising energy costs. Dr. Carabajal assured the group that all comments had ben looked at and the suggestion were being considered, but only comments directly related to the questions on the survey were included in the summary. Jeff Lang expressed a concern from another individual about the confidentiality of respondents to the survey. Dr. Carabajal assured the group that in all surveys that she conducts for research the option to include IP addresses is removed. (complete survey results attached)

3. Hiring and Selection Manual (Consultation)

Shelly Baxter questioned why the broader statement "B" on page 11 was limited to faculty and administrative positions. The suggestion to combine "A" and "B" or extend "B" to all employees was made. Jeff Lang questioned whether the statement on page 5 related to change or correction to job titles and/or descriptions. He was concerned that changes to job titles/descriptions by the supervisor and administrator be returned to negotiations prior to advertising. He also identified a typo on page 15.

4. Emergency Response Guide (Information)

Dr. Kayleigh Carabajal presented the Emergency Response Guide to be hung in all of the rooms on campus providing a standardized routine for response to emergencies. She identified that in addition to meeting an institutional need, this project addressed one of the recommendations from the 2008 accreditation self-study. Work continues on a much larger Emergency Response Plan based on the Incident Response System. Emergency Response Training is scheduled for the fall. There will also be several fire drills occurring during the fall. Shelly Baxter expressed the concern that everyone be aware that the responses with children are different that the generally expected responses. Dr. Carabajal assured her of the awareness, but articulated that the changes relative to children should not be widely published in order to better protect the children.

5. Personnel Update (Information) – Administration

Dr. Carabajal reiterated that the Bookstore Technician, Financial Aid II and Administrative Assistant III in Academic Services positions are moving forward. The Director for Allied Health and Nursing Instructor positions are still being advertised. All other positions are on hold.

Strategic Planning:

1. Establish the Budget Process Revision Committee - Cheryl Aschenbach

For the last several years the Academic Senate representatives have met with Consultation Council representatives to incorporate changes into the budget development handbook, which is published each fall. The Academic Senate appointed Cheryl Aschenbach, Sue Mouck and Garrett Taylor (if he is available) this year. Generally in the past Consultation Council has appointed the chair and chief business officer. Dave Clausen suggested himself and Terry Bartley because of her role in budget. Ross Stevenson objected to the budget development handbook returning to Consultation Council for acceptance following adoption by the Academic Senate. He articulated that budget development processes are in the purview of the Academic Senate and objected to anyone else participating in the process. Cheryl Aschenbach assured him that the Academic Senate did have purview over the process but had welcomed the institutional perspective in making recommendations for improvement. Mr. Stevenson expressed concern that Consultation Council might make changes to the process. He was assured that the Academic Senate approves the process and that the acceptance by Consultation Council is a mechanism to institutionalize the senate approved process. If a difference of opinion occurred between the senate and Consultation Council, the Academic Senate has primacy. Dr. Carabajal questioned the difference between the budget development process and program review process. Historically, the Academic Senate has had primacy over the institutional program review process, but the non-instructional program review process although based on the senate-developed process has involved broader participation in its development and approval. The instructional program review handbook has never been brought to Consultation Council. Chervl Aschenbach suggested that the budget process affects the entire institution, while the instructional program review process primarily impacts faculty.

2. 2012-2013 Strategic Master Plan – Governing Board Planning Retreat July 24, 2012 (Consultation) - continuation from last meeting

Due to the need of several members to attend the Commencement rehearsal, this item was postponed until next meeting.

Other:

1.Dave Clausen advised the group that he intends to schedule the Budget Advisory Team (BAT) meeting following the summer meetings of Consultation Council since so many individuals serve on both. The first meeting will be next week Wednesday, May 30, 2012.

2. Cheryl Aschenbach identified that the probable name of the new faculty center based on suggestions received was Technology Education and Collaboration Center (TEC Center).




Of 46 questions in the Spring 2012 survey administration, 39 exhibited an increase in percentage of respondents selecting "Strongly Agree" or "Agree" as compared to responses in the Spring 2011 survey results. For seven of the questions, percentages were lower as compared to responses from the prior year (10, 26, 35, 36, 43, 44 and 49). For six questions, the percentage increases were greater than 25% points (16, 20, 22, 25, 39 and 41).








Accreditation 2014 Self-Study/Evaluation Spring 2011 as compared to Spring 2012 Survey

Campus engagement in student success as measured by referrals to student support services is increasing as more staff members refer students to these services.

Open-ended comments: Campus personnel submitted a total of 19 comments when asked (unaided) concerning ways to improve the following:

- With regard to communication, respondents suggest informal collegial discussions (n=1) and being directed to accomplish the plans (n=1). Two comments were not applicable to the questions.
- Suggestions for improving the Planning Process included logistics (n=5 e.g., regularly scheduled meetings, more timely release of the staffing plan, video recording the meetings for later viewing and alternative methods for communicating decisions beyond meeting minutes), more grass roots participation in plan, formulation (n=2), stay focused on a smaller range of goals (n=1). Two comments were not applicable to the question.
- Suggestions for improving the CIMP included broader opportunities for faculty and staff input (n=3), more transperancy in decision-making (n=1) and 1 comment not applicable to the question.
