Development of sufficient proficiency in golf to recognize and enjoy the game as a lifetime activity; includes U.S.G.A. rules and etiquette and the fundamental mechanics involved in the use of irons and woods. Each student must purchase a 5-play card (45 total holes of golf) from Diamond Mountain Golf Club at the prevailing rate.
