Title IX Know Your Rights



Know Your Title IX

What is Title IX / VAWA?

"No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

-20 U.S.C. Section 1681

The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act was added to Title IX in 2013.

Title IX prohibits sexual harassment, including sexual violence. The VAWA prohibit sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking.

Who Is Covered Under Title IX?

All students, staff, and third-party visitors regardless of gender identity are covered under Title IX.

How Do You File A Claim?

1. Call the Title IX Coordinator at 530-251-8811.
2. Send an email to: kgilman@lassencollege.edu
3. File through the Maxient Reporting System



4. Walk in to the Title IX Coordinator's Office:

5. Ask the Title IX Coordinator to meet you in a location that is more comfortable for you.
6. Tell a trusted faculty or staff member
7. Call the local police, Susanville Police Department, at 530-257-5603; or call 911 if it is an emergency

What Are Your Rights Under Title IX?

- Schools may not retaliate against someone filing a complaint and must keep complainants safe from other retaliatory harassment.
- Schools should ensure that no student has to share campus spaces (such as dorms, classes, and workplaces) with their abuser.
- Schools can issue no-contact directives to prevent accused students from approaching or interacting with you.
- Schools must be proactive in ensuring that your campus is free from sex discrimination.
- Schools cannot discourage you from continuing your education.
