What is EOPS?



What is EOPS? EOPS is a California state and college funded program designed to assist students with economic, linguistic, and educational challenges enroll and succeed in higher education. Comprehensive support services are provided to promote access to college and to better support once the student is enrolled, to increase retention or transfer to four-year universities and colleges.

EOPS is located at BaseCamp in the Creative Arts building (CA 209) and is open from 8 am-4:30 pm, Monday thru Friday. Some of the support services include academic advising, dedicated counseling, book lending library, workshops and academic supplies. Conveniently located by the EOP&S area is a shared student space for EOP&S students to studying and use computers. Come by Basecamp and check it out to see if you qualify for the EOPS program.
