EOP&S Services

Counseling

EOP&S students work individually with a counselor to help them with educational and career goals. They provide academic, vocational, and personal counseling; assist with the financial aid progress; help with scheduling classes; provide vital information necessary to succeed in college, and so much more!

Free Tutoring

EOP&S Services

Priority Registration

EOP&S students are permitted to register before the general student population during Priority Registration week. This is offered to EOP&S students in order to make it easier for them to get the right classes and reach their educational goals.

EOP&S Services

Book Services

EOP&S students can take advantage of the book services offered through the program. Book vouchers are given to students to redeem for books at the Lassen Community College Bookstore.

Also available is the EOP&S Lending Library where students can borrow textbooks (on a first-come, first served basis depending on availability of books) along with lending laptops and TI84 calculators. Pick up will be by appointment only.

EOP&S Services

Transfer Assistance

When EOP&S students are ready to transfer, the EOP&S program will provide up to five application fee waivers for any school within the University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) system.

EOP&S Services

CARE

Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (C.A.R.E) is a program that assists single parents with child care expenses, transportation, books & supplies, and support services. To qualify, the parent must be:

- Eligible for EOP&S
- Single, head of household
- 18 years of age
- Someone in the household must be receiving cash aid from the welfare department

Student Responsibilities

Orientation

Both new and continuing students are required to attend an EOP&S Orientation Session each semester.

New student EOP&S Orientation is focused on detailing program rules and regulations, introducing key student support services staff, and other crucial information regarding participation in the EOP&S program. Continuing students will have a review of the program with the EOPS counselor.

Student Responsibilities

Mandatory Contact Sessions

In order to remain eligible for all EOP&S benefits each semester, EOP&S students must complete **3 contact sessions via phone, email or zoom.**

- +** **2** Contacts with your EOP&S counselor to update your Educational Plan and Register for Classes or Exit Interview.
- 1** Contact with your EOP&S Advisor to turn in your Progress Report Form.

3 Total Contact Sessions per semester.

Student Responsibilities

Academic Success

Besides completing the three mandatory contacts, students must also maintain academic success in order to be in good standing with the EOP&S program.

Academic success is defined as:

- Completing 12 units each semester
- Earning a minimum GPA of 2.0
- Completing a progress report

Student Eligibility

Eligibility Requirements

1. Be a California Resident
2. Enroll in 12 or more units (unless qualified for an exception)
3. Have fewer than 70 degree applicable units from all colleges/universities attended.
4. Qualify for the Board of Governor's Wavier A or B and meet income guidelines.
5. Meet the educationally disadvantaged criteria.

Student Eligibility

Who is educationally disadvantaged?

A student is considered educationally disadvantaged if she/he meets ONE of the following conditions:

- Did not graduate from high school
- Have a high school GPA of 2.49 or below
- First generation college student
- Placement test scores indicate remediation in Reading, Writing, or Math
- Parents are non-native English speakers, or be a member of an underrepresented ethnic group
